



Loews Corporation Announces Redemption of 7% Senior Notes Due 2023; Announces Completion of \$400 Million Notes Offerings

NEW YORK--(BUSINESS WIRE)--Jan. 27, 2005--Loews Corporation (NYSE: LTR) announced today that on February 28, 2005 it will redeem all of its outstanding \$400 million principal amount 7% Senior Notes due October 15, 2023 (CUSIP Number 540424 AJ7) at a redemption price of 102.148% of the principal amount, plus interest accrued to that date. On that date, the redemption price will become payable to the holders of the 7% notes and the 7% notes will cease accruing interest.

The Company also announced today that it has completed the sale of \$300 million principal amount of its 6% Senior Notes due 2035 and \$100 million principal amount of its 5-1/4% Senior Notes due 2016 in a public offering underwritten by Citigroup Global Markets Inc. The Company will use the proceeds from these offerings, together with cash on hand, to fund the redemption price of its 7% notes.
